The words of our 2022 attendees were so thought-provoking that I wanted to share some of what they told us.

Connection and education

Above all, attendees raved about the value of networking, telling us the annual meeting "...means connection. It means mentorship. It means growing my network ... There's something about meeting people in person. There's something about connecting with people you've met on social media, and just having that in person connection that ... is vital" (*Tolu Kehinde*, MD, MBA).

Others talked about the value of the education they received, saying "the ed-



ucation that I get here has always been a key component of me evolving with the state of the art of anesthesiology. I certainly value all the research that I get from journals and textbooks. But to see knowledge come to life here at the conference, it's unparalleled. I can't imagine a better way to interact with my profession and get my learning done at the same time" (Michael Stout, CAA).

Research and advocacy

Research and advocacy also earned high praise. One attendee extolled the value of seeing "people from all over the world presenting their research and the things that they're interested in. It's a great way to connect with a lot of people and learn about what everyone's doing in the field" (Ankith Palpnuri Reddy). Another pointed out that the conference did a good job addressing the importance of "advocacy for our profession, especially now, more than ever" (Sachin S. Kulkarni, MD).

Energy and opportunity

Residents and medical students told us that "ASA is where it happens." One medical student called ANESTHESIOLOGY the

place "where you will have an opportunity to meet so many amazing people that you wouldn't get to meet otherwise ... an amusement park for anesthesiologists" (*Iman Ahmed Soliman*).
